WOT badges for your website

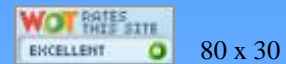

Messages from WOT Users

Every day we receive emails from people around the world. Most often the letters are from satisfied users. This one tickled our funny-bone, so we wanted to share it with you.

Ask WOT

Q

Are my ratings anonymous?

Yes, ratings are anonymous (or [pseudonymous](#), more specifically) unless you choose to create an account on our website and reveal your identity. If you simply use the add-on, your ratings are linked to a random identifier generated when the add-on was first installed.

Q

How does WOT use my IP address? Is it private?

We are serious about privacy and would never misuse your personal information. Your IP address is stored in our server logs for 30 days, after which all logs are deleted. Please read our [privacy policy](#) for more information.

Q

Sometimes I am unable to agree or disagree with comments on the scorecards. What's up with that?

On domains with controversial ratings, the agree/disagree function is disabled. However, you may rate and add your own new comment.

Q

How do I delete a rating?

There are now two ways to do it. One way is to go to your Profile page and select the **My Ratings** tab. You can delete a rating by clicking on the red X.

A new way is to delete it straight from the scorecard. Click **Edit my rating**, and an option to **Delete** appears.
